Since this is a Sept-Oct Newsletter, you will have 2 articles from Bro. Jerl.

I want to give you a definition of the Christian life in seven words. It is found in 2 Cor. 5:7... We walk by faith, not by sight. Walking by sight is normal for us. That's just what we naturally do. We see things in the physical world, and we know they are real. We see the sun, and we know it is there, and we know it gives heat and light. We see a shade tree, and we know it is real, and we can get under it and get relief from the sun. All of that is great, but while walking by sight is okay for living strictly in the physical realm, there is another realm of life just as real, and that is the spiritual realm. Walking by sight doesn't work in the spiritual realm. To illustrate:

A professor asked a student....

"Do you see the green grass?" "Yes."

"Do you see the clouds?" "Yes."

"Do you see the sky?" "Yes."

"So you know these things exist, right?" "Yes."

"Now, do you see God?" "No."

"Then God does not exist."

Another student spoke up quickly, and asked the student, "Do you see the professor?" "Yes." "Do you see his head?" "Yes." "So you know he exists, right?" "Yes." "Do you see his brain?" "No." "Then his brain does not exist."

Walking by sight works wonderfully in the physical realm, but it does not work in the spiritual realm.

We also walk by faith in the physical realm. We see a chair, and sit in it. We have faith that it will support us. We fly in an airplane. We have faith in those who designed it and in those who maintain it, and in the laws of aerodynamics.

But walking by faith in the physical realm is not what Paul was talking about. He was talking about walking, not by sight, but by faith in the spiritual realm. How do we do that? Is it just a blind leap? No.

Paul gives us the answer in Romans 10:17...faith comes by hearing and hearing by the Word of Christ.

What's he saying? The more we immerse ourselves in the Word of God, the more faith we have. When we read God's Word, we find that God is true to his Word in everything he says in it. If we don't read it, then we can't believe it. But the more we read it, the more our faith in God grows. It may start out with just little things, but as God continues to prove himself through his Word, we will find that we can and do, indeed, learn to walk by faith, and not by sight.

Let's all continue to read and study the Word of God so that we may be learning to walk by faith and not by sight.

One of my favorite of the Lord's promises in scripture is, "I will never leave you nor forsake you". We find that promise five times in the Bible: Deuteronomy 31:6, 8, Joshua 1:5, 1 Chronicles 28:20, and Hebrews 13:5. (The writer of Hebrews is quoting from the Old Testament.) I find it interesting that the Greek word for "leave" in Hebrews 13:5, is a word that means "to loose or to untie", and that the Greek word for "forsake", is a word that means "to abandon". I believe what the Lord is saying to us is that He will never "cut us loose" (He will never sever our relationship with Him), and that He will never abandon us. There will never be a time when He is not right there with us, no matter what we do, or no matter what we are going through. When we received Jesus as our Lord and Savior, we became a child of God, and the Father will never forsake His children.

Life on this earth is difficult. It is sometimes difficult because of some of the choices we make, and it is sometimes difficult because we live in a fallen world that is filled with pain and heartache. Satan loves to use our sin and/or our circumstances to knock us flat on our backs. Then he loves to say, "Well, if God really loves you, why did he allow this to happen? Truth is, God has abandoned you." Sad thing is that people who don't know the Lord, and even many who do know him, believe Satan's lies. Like many of you, I have been knocked to the ground many times in my life. For me, the most devastating blow in my life to date, was the death of my first wife. I know that many of you, having lost a spouse, know what I am talking about. I know it must also be devastating to lose a child in death. I can't even imagine what the parents of those students killed here in Santa Fe are going through.

I do know that back in 2008, when I was about at my lowest point, I recalled something I had read about years earlier. I firmly believe the Lord brought it to my mind. It concerned an Olympic Runner who fell to the ground, but then got up and finished the race with his father's help. So I 'googled" it, and sure enough, I found it. The runner was Derek Redmond, and it was the 1992 Olympics. He popped a ham string muscle during the 400m race, and fell to the ground. He managed to get back up, and started hobbling toward the finish line, crying all the way. Then his father, eluding security, ran onto the track, put his arm around his son, and helped him along the remainder of the course. The crowd of 65,000 people, including the other runners, were cheering and clapping and crying, as Derek finally made it to the finish line, searing with pain and sobbing with disappointment. But his father did not leave him nor forsake him.

As I said, this world will knock us to the ground, and Satan will laugh at us and mock us, but we can be sure that our Father will never leave us nor forsake us. (BTW, if you will go to youtube.com, and type in Derek Redmond – Never Give Up, you can see the video).

God's Work at Mission Santa Fe


From July 23-27 our church teamed up with two other churches, First Baptist Alta Loma, and Saltgrass Cowboy Church to host Mission Santa Fe. This was our fourth year to participate in this community outreach event and God blessed in enormous ways! Here's a quick recap of the ways we were able to minister that week:

- We hosted a Backyard Bible Club every morning, Monday-Friday, at Runge Park where we had a giant waterslide, a bounce house, a petting zoo, popcorn, snow cones, hotdogs, face painting, balloon animals, arts and crafts, board games, kickball, water rec games, music, Bible stories and more! We had over 250 children attend the Bible Club! Five salvation decisions were made, and one who had given her life to Christ prior to the week of Mission Santa Fe made a decision to follow through in believer's baptism.
- We sent a team to serve at H.I.S. Ministry, and we held a food drive at Arlan's where we collected several bags of food and over \$100 in monetary donations to help the ministry.
- On multiple days we visited the laundry mats in town, paid for people's laundry, and prayed with
- We took about 20 plates of cookies to city offices, ISD offices, and businesses around town. We thanked them for their service to our community and prayed over any needs they had.
- We played Bingo with residents at the Heritage Crossing Retirement Home, provided prizes for the participants, visited and prayed with them, and shared the gospel.
- We delivered Sonic free drink coupons around town and prayed with people.
- We handed out bags of chips and Sonic free drink coupons to Santa Fe High School students who were entering the high school building for the first time since leaving for the summer. We let them know that we are praying for them to have a good year and that we are here for them.
- We wrote 26 notes to city, county, and state officials, encouraging them and thanking them for their service and wrote other notes to homebound individuals.
- We visited homebound people in our community and helped them by cleaning their homes, doing yard work for them, and taking time to visit with them.
- We took bottled waters to hand out at the Sea Wall in Galveston, prayed with the people there, and handed out gospel tracts.
- We held a family movie night at Runge Park where

we shared the gospel then showed the movie, "I Can Only Imagine." About 120 were in attendance. All children in attendance at the Bible club were mailed a letter, information on our church, and a gospel tract. Visitation teams are visiting the homes of children who made decisions and are delivering Bibles to them.

We were so privileged to be able to help our community, and we could not have done it on such a large scale had you not selflessly given your time, energy, and money to support this outreach effort. We had over 80 volunteers help out in the course of the week and countless others contributed financially.

Thank you from the bottom of my heart! God moved in amazing ways during Mission Santa Fe and I want to give Him all the glory for allowing the gospel to be shared with so many in our community.

On August 25th AFBC hosted a fundraiser concert for the


